RESOLUTION OF GOVERNMENT.

In accordance with the provision made in clause (b) (i) of Bombay Civil Services Rule 50, Government may direct that extra-ordinary leave taken by a permanent Government servant shall be counted for increments subject to the conditions mentioned therein. The Government is pleased to decide that the extra-ordinary leave availed of by permanent Government servants for the purpose of undertaking higher Scientific and technical studies may be allowed to count for increments under the rule mentioned above.

2. The Government is also pleased to decide that the extra-ordinary leave availed of by temporary and officiating Government servants for the purpose of higher scientific and technical studies may be allowed to count for increments in the officiating appointment if an officer has put in at least three years' service under this Government at the time of proceeding on such leave, provided that a certificate is given by the appointing authority that the officer would have continued to officiate in that post or a post on the same time scale but for his proceeding on leave.

3. The consequential amendment to Bombay Civil Services Rule 50 will issue in due course.
