

Prefixing and suffixing Sundays
and Public Holidays to Casual leave.

Resolution:

According to orders contained in Govt. Resolution Finance Deptt. No. LVE-1456/S-5, dated the 9th April 1957, not more than two holidays can be enjoyed in conjunction with any spell of casual leave whether by prefixing or by suffixing or by both and further that no holidays can be interposed between periods of casual leave.

2. The question of removing these restrictions was under consideration of Govt. for some time past. Govt. is pleased to direct that Govt. servants may be permitted to prefix and/or suffix any number of Sundays and/or public Holidays to casual leave. They may also be permitted to interpose a holiday or a series of holidays between the periods of casual leave. However, the existing condition that the total period of casual leave and Holidays enjoyed in continuation at one time should not exceed 7 days, save only in exceptional circumstances when it may be extended upto 10 days, will continue as before.

3. These orders will take effect from the date of issue and shall be in force on experimental basis for a period of one year in the first instance. The heads of Offices/Departments should keep a watch on the implementation of these orders and report to Finance Department whether the concession extended in paragraph 2 above results in any administrative inconvenience. The reports in the matter should be sent to the Administrative Departments concerned who in turn should give their comments so as to reach Finance Department by the end of February 1982.
