

Provision of minimum service  
as a condition for promotion  
to higher posts -

(2) Government Circular, General Administration Department, No. SRV-1277-XII, dated the 3rd September, 1979.

CIRCULAR :- The question of modification of the orders contained in the Government Circular, General Administration Department, No. SRV-1277-XII, dated the 14th October 1977 as amended by the Government Circular, General Administration Department, No. SRV-1277-XII, dated the 3rd September 1979 was under the Consideration of Government. Government has now decided to do away with the condition regarding minimum period of service for promotions to posts within the same Class of service and for promotion from one class of service, to another, it has been decided that a total period of three years service in the lower class of service should be adequate. Accordingly, the revised norms of minimum service for promotion should be as follows :-

- (1) For promotions within the same Class - No period of minimum service (i.e. within class-III or Class -II or Class I as the case may be).
- (2) For promotions from a post in Class-III to a post in Class-II Service. - 3 years in Class-III Service.
- (3) For promotion from a post in Class-II to a post in Class-I Service. - 3 years in Class-II Service.

2. 2. The Departments of Mantralaya are requested to follow the above norms for regulating promotions pending amendment to the relevant Recruitment Rules for various posts and Services under the administrative Control.
