Resolution

According to the provisions contained in para 1(iv) of the Government Resolution cited above, in case a Government servant dies in harness, the cash equivalent of the leave salary that the deceased Government Servant would have got, had he gone on earned leave, but for the death, due and admissible, on the date immediately following the date of death, subject to a maximum of leave salary for 120 days, shall be paid to his family, subject to reduction of the amount of pension and pension equivalent of the Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity due to the deceased Government servant on the date of his death. The point was however, raised whether the cash equivalent of leave salary admissible to the family of the deceased employee will also include dearness allowance at the appropriate rates. Government is pleased to clarify that the cash equivalent of leave subject to a maximum of leave salary for 120 days admissible to the family of the deceased Government servant in terms of para 1 (iv) of the Government Resolution, Finance Department, dated 23rd October 1974 referred to above should also carry the appropriate amount of dearness allowance. Cash equivalent of the leave salary will, of course, be subject to reduction of the amount of pension and pension equivalent of the Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity due to the deceased Government servant on the date of his death.

These orders will have effect from 1st October 1974.
