CIRCULAR OF GOVERNMENT.

It has come to the notice of Government that in many of the cases referred to the various Heads of Departments by the Anti-Corruption Bureau suggesting departmental action against the delinquents on various charges enquired into by the Bureau, the charges could not be proved as the officers of the Bureau who had made the enquiries and the important witnesses whose evidence recorded by the Bureau in the preliminary enquiries was material for establishing the charges against the delinquents, were not examined by the Enquiry Officers during the course of departmental enquiries. The Bureau had therefore to approach the higher authorities in all such cases for reviewing the orders already passed by the lower authorities on the basis of the findings of the enquiry officer. This creates avoidable work for all concerned and results in delay in finalising the cases. In order to obviate this, Government is pleased to direct that in departmental enquiry cases instituted at the instance of the Anti-Corruption Bureau, the Enquiry Officers should call for and examine the officer of the Bureau who had conducted the preliminary enquiries and also the important witnesses whose evidence as recorded by the Bureau would be material for establishing the charges against the delinquents. All Officers conducting departmental enquiries should bear these instructions in mind.
