RESOLUTION OF GOVERNMENT.



In Government Resolution, General Administration Department NO. SRV-1074-D, dated the 28th January, 1975, read with Government Resolution, General Administration Department NO. SRV-1075-342-X, dated the 1st April, 1976, Government has laid down the principles to be observed in the matter of promotions from a lower to a higher grade, service or post. Government has now decided that in respect of Class I and Class II field officers of the State Services, experience of work in Tribal areas of the State for a period of not less than 2 years should be considered as an additional qualification for their promotion.

2. It may, however, happen that in some cases, the field Officers may not get a posting in Tribal areas for no fault of their own until their turn for promotion comes up and in such cases it would not be proper to deny the officers their due promotions only on the ground that they lack experience which they had not been afforded an opportunity to acquire. Lack of experience in Tribal areas in the case of such Officers should not, therefore, be made a ground for their supersession. At the same time, Government desires to make it clear that it would be the responsibility of the administrative Departments of the Secretariat and the Heads of the Departments to ensure that as many field officers as possible get posting in Tribal areas before they become due for promotion to Class I and Class II Posts. The Secretariat Departments and the Heads of the Departments should, therefore, plan in advance the postings and transfers of field officers under their respective administrative control in such a way that as many of the Officers as possible get experience of working in Tribal areas for a period of atleast two years.

3. All Departments of the Secretariat and Heads of Departments should ensure that the decision of Government as above is implemented while effecting transfers and promotions.
