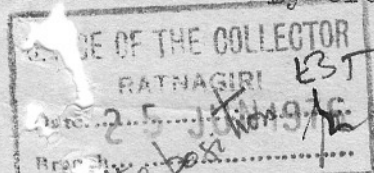

CIRCULAR OF GOVERNMENT

Under Government Circular, General Administration Department, No.SRV-1075-X, dated the 27th February 1976, all Heads of Departments were directed to see that in the case of all Government servants, who, as on 1st April 1976, are eligible for the benefits of a substantive status in service, in accordance with Government Resolution, General Administration Department, No.SRV-1075-X, dated the 19th September 1975, the requisite certificates should be recorded on or before the 31st May 1976. *page 2*

2. It is observed from a few reports since received that the pace of this work is very slow and not even one third of the Government servants who are eligible for them have been given the certificates. The orders regarding the benefits of permanency to temporary Government servants were issued in September 1975 and during the last 8 or 9 months, no appreciable progress seems to have been made in giving permanency certificates to eligible temporary Government servants. Government considers that this position is quite unsatisfactory and desires to impress upon all Heads of Departments once again the urgent necessity of ensuring that the cases of all Government servants under their control are examined expeditiously and those who are eligible for the benefits of permanency ~~also~~ actually receive them without avoidable delay. ~~Thereby~~ All Heads of Departments are accordingly requested to take immediate action as indicated in this Department Circular No.SRV-1075-X, dated the 27th February 1976 and to send a compliance report to this department by 1st July 1976 under intimation to their respective Administrative Department of the Secretariat.
