CIRCULAR OF GOVERNMENT

The question whether it is legally feasible to recover one month's pay in lieu of notice period from a Government servant who resigns his appointment without giving prior notice of one month had been under the consideration of Government for sometime past. Government has now been advised that a stipulation in an appointment order to the effect that the appointment of an appointee is purely temporary and can be terminated at any time without assigning any reason therefor, and that if he/she desires to resign the post he/she should give one month's notice or forfeit one month's pay in lieu thereof is legally feasible in order and unobjectionable. It is, therefore, legally feasible to recover one month's pay from a Government servant who resigns his appointment without giving prior notice of one month provided a stipulation to that effect was made in his appointment order.
